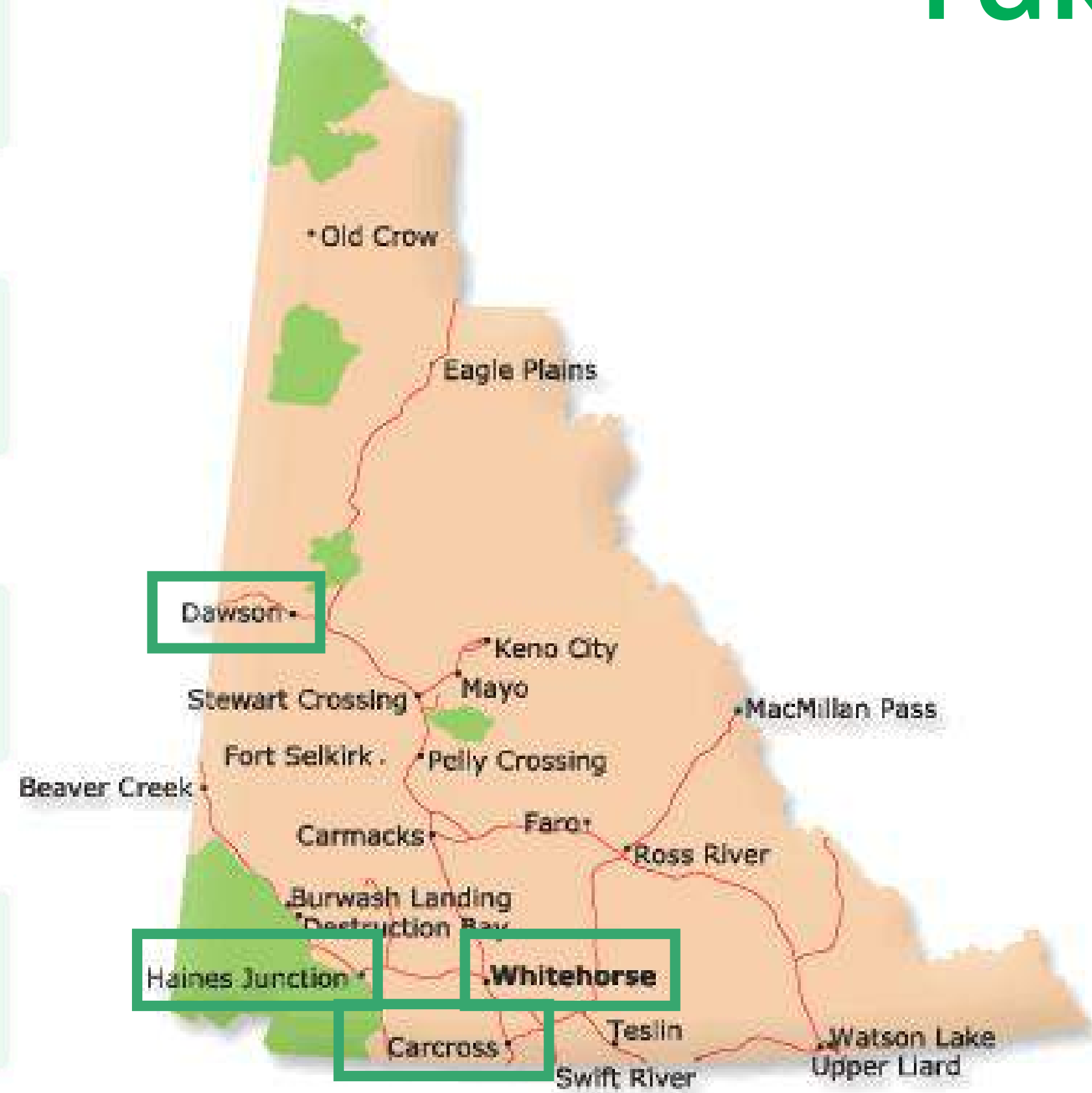

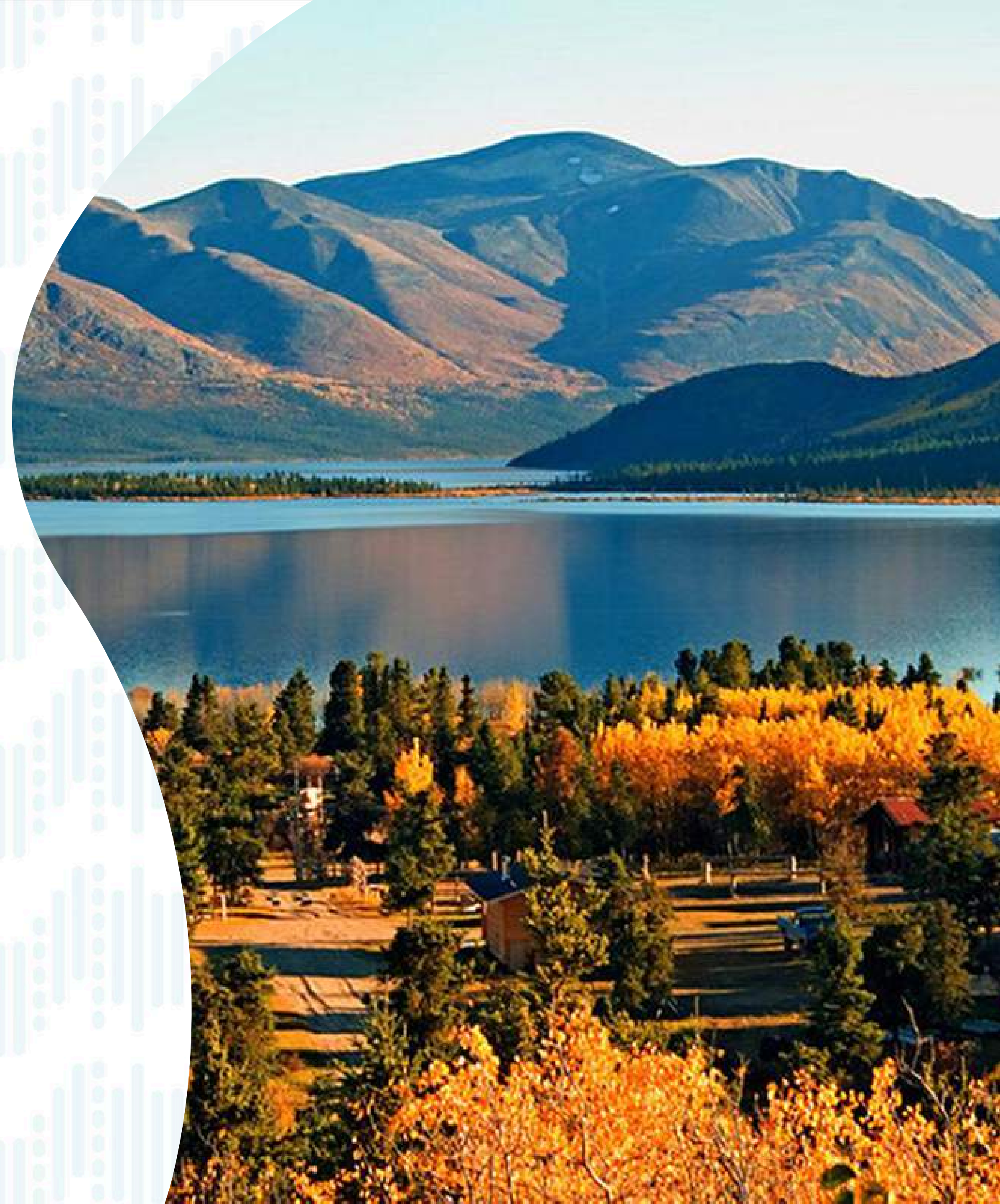

While in the Yukon, your group has a number of entertainment options to choose from. The following pages list a variety of Yukon themed attractions available to your group. Should your group have a pre / post or spousal program to accommodate, here are some suggestions to excite your group and make your event and their trip to Yukon unforgettable!

Keep in mind.....If your groups number exceed the suggested group size, there is often a way around it. Yukoners pride themselves on finding ways to make things happen! The Yukon Convention Bureau and partners, will work with your planners to find solutions to make your event a success.



Yukon Wildlife Preserve

Kilometer 8/Mile 5, Takhini Hot Springs Road, Whitehorse, Yukon

Experience 12+ iconic Yukon species spread over 350 acres. Walk the 5KM loop or join a regularly scheduled 1 1/2 hour guided bus tour.

- Book a tour (on a warm bus) with an interpreter from the Yukon Wildlife Preserve. See and learn about Yukon wildlife and the efforts made to preserve our furry and feathery friends. Did we mention May is baby season?! This tour follows the 5 km loop, making regular stops for viewing animals and taking photos. The tour is led by a knowledgeable interpreter who will provide insight into Yukon's iconic wildlife. Bus tours are offered in English. Pre-purchase/booking recommended.
- Group tour options - If you would like to visit with a large group, or you have special scheduling, or other requirements a step-on charter may be for you!
Step ons: One of our guides will "Step-on" to your tour vehicle. This is a good option for large groups and/or groups on a tight schedule.
Charters: You specially reserve one of the Preserve's tour busses for your group! It seats up to 22-24, and is ideal for groups that don't have access to a larger vehicle of their own.
- Bus Tour Schedule: Daily - 11am, 1pm & 3pm.
- Bus Tour Tickets: Includes General Admission. Adult - \$26.00, Youth - \$19.00, and Infant - \$0
- The Yukon Wildlife Preserve has a wheelchair accessible, low-floor bus. Please call ahead to book so capacity can be adjusted.

- **The Pools:** The Eclipse Pool (largest pool) authentic Japanese design and seats 30; The Onsen Pool (smallest and most sheltered pool) seats 10; The Aurora Pool (centre-piece) with a panoramic view of the area; The Hidden Pool (tucked away behind the eclipse pool) closed during the winter as it is used as a colder pool for cooling off in between use of the hot pools
- **Japanese Clay tubs** - Clay “hot pots” or tubs handmade in Japan and the clay comes from the famous Shigaraki area; Clay tubs are available in the summertime only
- **Relaxation Rooms:** The Sunroom is a bright, window-lined sunroom for sunbathing in winter or summer; The Hibernation offers 9 beautiful, tile covered lounge chairs, heated with hot water lines, A “no-talking” zone, this relax room is meant to encourage deep rest in an undisturbed environment; The Upper Relax Room is on the top floor and is the highest point in the whole facility, it offers a sunroom and also the best views
- **Firebowls:** is in the Club Mud area where you can sit around the fire and let the mud dry on your body from the heat of the fire. Once the mud is dry, rinse it all off in comfortable hot springs shower, featuring warm mineralized water directly from the ground under natural pressure
- **Cold Plunges and Showers:** are a corner stone of any Nordic Spa and hold an important role when practicing contrast temperature hydrotherapy
- **Saunas and Steam Rooms:** Warm Sauna (perfect for first-timers); Hot Sauna (designed for a heat workout) may be scented at times, seats 6; Solar Steam Room (covered in tile, not scented); Lunar Steam Room (infused with refreshing eucalyptus)
- **Hot Rock Cafe:** The menu rotates on a (mostly) daily basis. Featuring a mix of International cuisines and some closer to home flavour profiles, Local pairing with Yukon based companies such as: Yukon Brewing, Yukon Ice cream company, Rambles/coffee, tea and spice, Aroma Borealis, Tum Tum meats, Yukon Berry farms, Bullet hole bagels, Stacy’s Butcher Block and Cultured Fine Cheese, Alcohol is available with a one drink maximum due to distance from downtown and the dehydrating nature of the hot springs

In May 2016 Lumel Studios opened in Whitehorse, Yukon. The glass blowing studio in downtown Whitehorse with a crew that included four glass blowing artists, a student engineer, a student astrophysicist, an Australian tourist, a hitch hiker from Quebec, a sculpture instructor from Louisiana, a ceramic artist from Alberta, two first nations youths - one from the Yukon and one from Alberta, a retired carpenter/sled dog musher, and a nursing student. This diversity in our building crew resulted in a studio built with substance and a powerful spirit and communal presence.

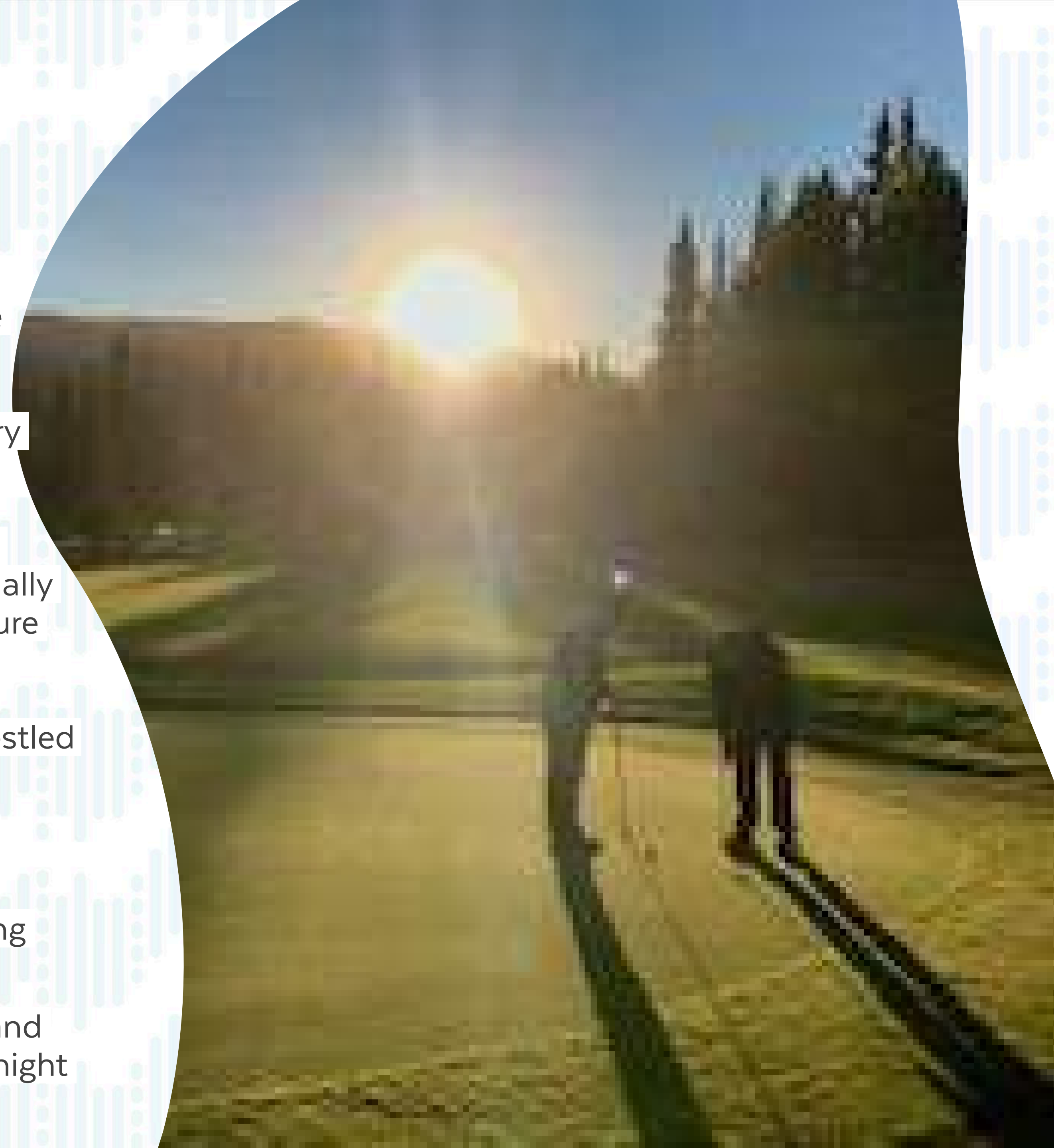

- Stop in for a stone-oven pizza and fresh donuts at Caribou Crossing Trading Post, then wander through the RCMP and taxidermy museum to see a Woolly Mammoth or step outside into the puppy yard and take a cart/sled ride with an award-winning Musher.
- Speed down 'Mountain Hero Mine Trail', a world class mountain biking route on Montana Mountain in Carcross. These trails are maintained by 'Singletrack to Success', a local first nation youth program.
- Visit the haunted Caribou Hotel and hear the story of Polly the Parrot and Bessie Gideon, both rumoured to reside post mortem, over a pint of local Winterlong beer in the Surly Bird Saloon, Carcross
- Skydiving over Carcross Desert, "Smallest Desert in the World"
- Fish off the bridge or shore in the remote hamlet of Tagish for Lake Trout, don't forget to stop at Slow Foods restaurant at the 6 Mile resort to sit rivers edge and explore this heritage property that was used as an RCMP telegraph post in the early 1900's

Gateway to the Klondike

Skagway, with a population of just over 1100, is located at the northernmost point of the Inside Passage in Southeast Alaska, 103 air miles north of Juneau and 110 road miles south of Whitehorse, Yukon.

Nestled at the northernmost reaches of the Inside Passage, the streets are lined with wooden boardwalks and restored buildings, looking much as they did over 100 years ago.

Skagway's history and spectacular natural setting create unparalleled sightseeing and recreation opportunities. Poke around on your own, or select from a variety of commercial tours. Either way, you will be amply rewarded with the sights and activities in and around Skagway.

Skagway is filled with outstanding dining options, abundant shopping, exceptional entertainment and three very fine museums. Many artists have made Skagway home with their work showcased in many of the downtown shops. Look for the 'Made in Skagway' logo for products that are crafted locally.

Skagway has five churches, one library and one financial institution. We also have over 200 hotel/ motel rooms in nine facilities ranging from modern to historical, including four bed & breakfasts. There is parking for 175 recreational vehicles. Limited tent camping sites are available in the summer.

For recreation there are two parks, one recreation center, a playground, bowling, museums, fishing, hiking, boating, camping facilities, ice skating, skiing and snowmobiling. A portion of the Skagway downtown area has been designated as the Skagway Unit of the Klondike Gold Rush National Historical Park; nearly one million visitors are expected in the summer. Skagway is the embarkation point for the famous Chilkoot and White Pass trails.

Famous for its hospitality, Skagway offers visitors all the amenities they desire for a relaxing, adventurous and unforgettable stay!

- **Red Onion Tours:** Come join the fun and informative women of the Red Onion Saloon! Featuring the Ghosts & Goodtime Girls Walking Tour (2 hrs) or our in-house "Quickie" Brothel Museum Tour (20 mins). Our Madams are all gifted story tellers and offer a vivid glimpse into the adventurous, daring and sometimes tragic lives of the women of the Klondike Gold Rush. Don't miss this tour! Open: Seasonal
- **Skagway Street Car Company:** Pioneer tourism promoter Martin Itjen's original homemade 1923 "Skagway Street Car" gave President Harding the first motorized city tour in Alaska. Today the SSCC provides old-time city sightseeing in restored 1920s buses with costumed conductors (this tour is also available in 8 international languages in a professionally produced audio format), as well as offering Summit Tours up the Klondike Highway to the US/Canadian Border, Yukon Scenic Drive tours into the Yukon Territory, and a guided professional audio "Rail and Highway Tour" that is also available in 8 international languages. Open: Seasonal
- **Whitepass & Yukon Route Railway:** White Pass & Yukon Route Railway "The Scenic Railway of the World". Built in 1898 during the Klondike Gold Rush, this narrow gauge railroad is an International Historic Civil Engineering Landmark. Experience the breathtaking panorama of mountains, glaciers, trestles & tunnels from the comfort of vintage rail cars. The White Pass & Yukon Route is Alaska's most popular shore excursion and a favorite on many Alaska/Yukon travelers' must-see lists.

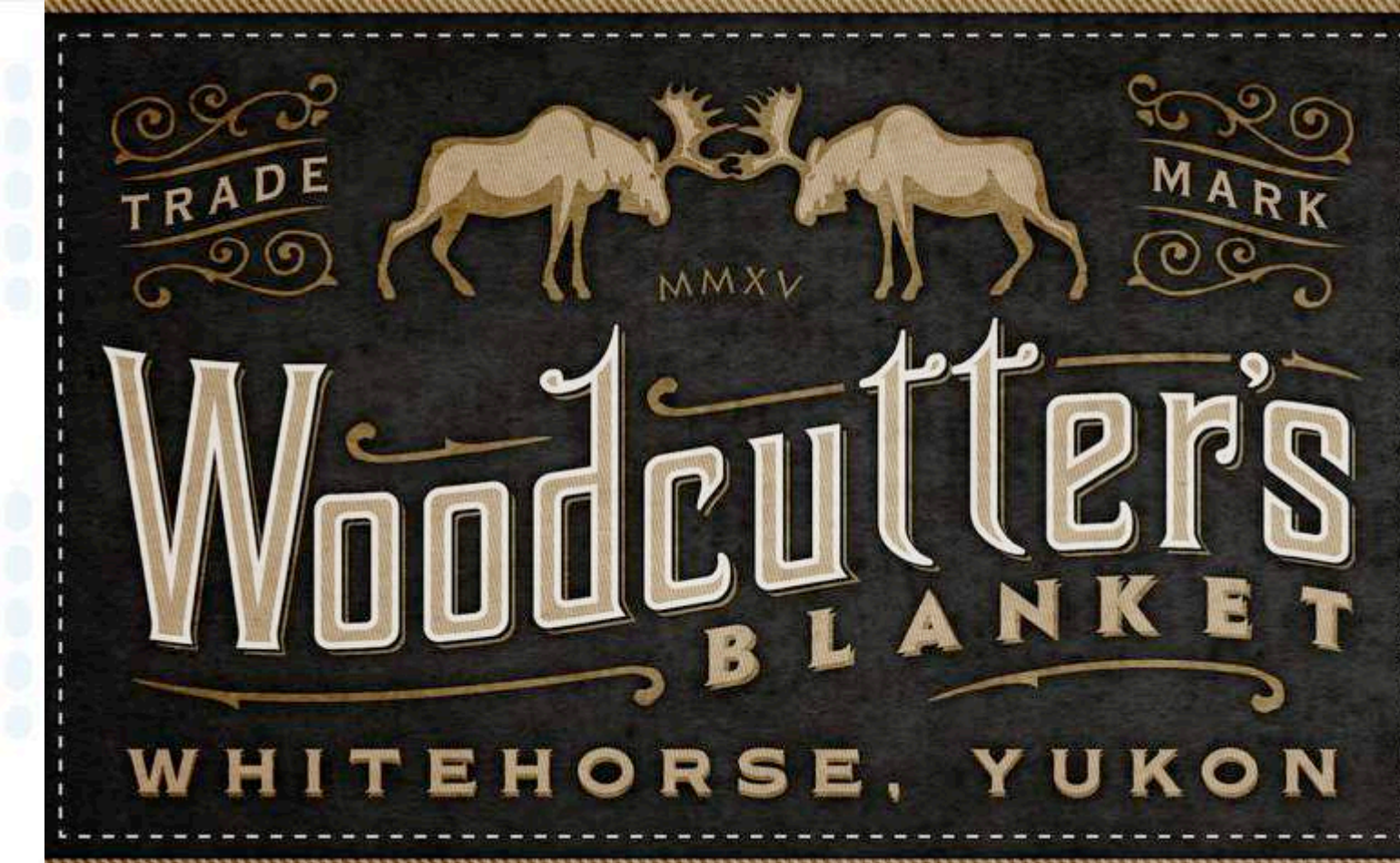

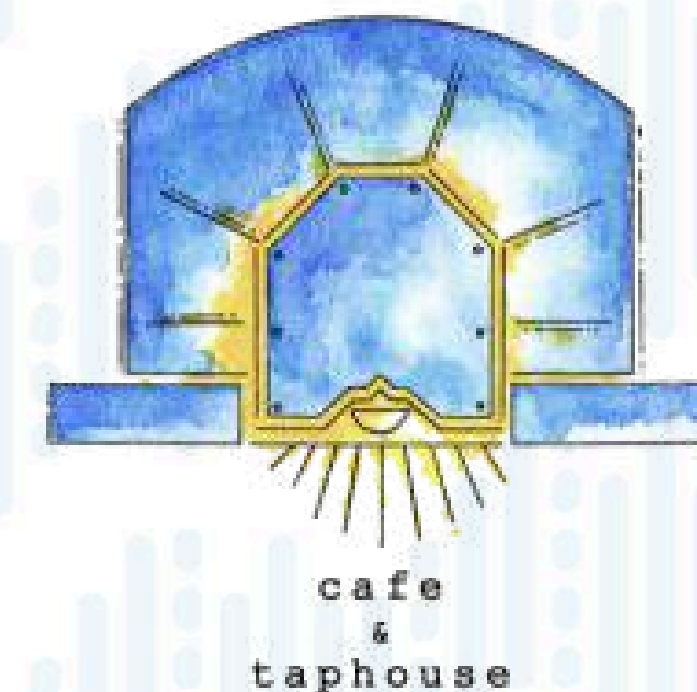
